'Daly' was first sighted in May of 2003. He was named after the Parks Victoria Ranger for the Snowy River National Park, Jim Daly, who retired in August that year. Although, Daly has been sighted on a few occasions he is still to be caught. However, field workers have been able to get close enough to determine that Daly is definitely male and can be easily identified by small tears in his ears.
